

The Andrew Moore award went to Hollie Grehan. Well done to all the award winners.



Well done to Lucy Kennedy in first year who received Highly commended in the Cre Ceramics competition. Well done Lucy.



Our first match was against St. Mary's CBS - our biggest local rivals. Many of the lads from both sides play club rugby together so each team was desperate to win and have the bragging rights. The first half was tight with both teams scoring 2 tries each and we took a narrow 12 - 10 lead at half time. In the second we managed to take control of the match and scored 3 more tries and secured a comfortable 31 - 17 victory. The bragging rights were ours!!! Our second match was against Mountmellick CS - we knew this would be a tough match and it was very close last time we played them in the Harry Nicholls cup competition. 
